Bahrain	Yes	Yes	Certified only – standard Arab C of O Legalised – Bahrain Embassy C of O, template available from HCC
Iraq	Yes	Yes	Certify only – only if C of O will not be used in Iraq, ABCC will likely want confirmation it won't be used in Iraq Proof of origin – must be simple e.g. declaration that refers to the part number not a supplier's invoice/purchase order No amendments allowed No handwritten info allowed, only signatures No electronic signatures on invoices Invoices must be called 'invoice' or 'commercial invoice' - 'shipping invoice' 'regular invoice' etc won't be accepted No double sided invoices C of O must show invoice number and date Copy of cargo document e.g. bill of lading required (won't be legalised) If goods haven't shipped yet then copy of the shipping note will be required Only one original invoice per C of O, may have copies stamped COPY Any non-UK goods – signed letter on company headed paper stating goods have been produced for their benefit

Lebanon	Yes	Yes	Electronic stamps and signatures not accepted, invoice must be originally signed Medicines, chemical products and by-products should be accompanied by a declaration on invoice as to whether they are hazardous or non-hazardous and that they are free for sale in the UK Invoices must have following declaration: "We certify that the present invoice is authentic, that it is the only one issued by us for the goods mentioned there in, that it gives the exact value without deduction of any payment on account and that they are of origin" Invoice must show medicines and foods expiry date Only one original invoice per C of O, may have copies stamped COPY Copy C of O only under letter of credit
Libya	Yes	Yes	Electronic stamps and signatures not accepted, invoice must be originally signed C of O can be certified or legalised on its own, need copy of the invoice for back up "Invoice Value: £..." must be shown in remarks box of C of O All documents need to be translated as part of the legalisation process
Morocco	Yes	No	Embassy no longer legalise, documents to be certified by ABCC then apostilled by FCO

Oman	Yes	Yes	Embassy won't legalise documents with FCO apostille
Qatar	No	Yes	Electronic stamps and signatures not accepted, invoice must be originally signed All invoices should be original or stamped original All invoices should show the currency. Should be typed Continual information must not be written on reverse of C of O or invoice, continuation document/page must be used

All items on invoice must have origin and manufacturer shown on the Arab C of O, any items not covered by C of O must be removed from invoice

C of O covering any type of weapon must include copy of the end user certificate

Lost/replacement C of Os

In remarks box need statement 'This certificate of origin numbered..... replaces certificate of origin number..... which is considered null and void.'

Invoice needs to be renumbered e.g. 12345A and needs statement 'This invoice numbered..... replaces invoice number..... which is considered null and void.'
